Dear young friends in Christ,

There are many ways we can listen to God speaking to us. God our Father loved the world so much that he sent his only Son, Jesus, into the world, to be a human being just like each one of us.


The little baby in the manger over 2000 years ago is God's gift of himself to us.

It was dirty and smelly in there with the animals. But at least Mary could rest there and there was nowhere else.




That night Mary's baby son was born. She wrapped him up warmly in the clothes she had made, and laid him in a manger to sleep.
